Sadly, we live in a world filled with broken relationships

- o Bitter business partnerships

The principles that you sow into a relationship will determine what you reap

Many of us take our relationships for granted and only seek help when there is a problem

The truth is if we don't deal with the pain of a bad relationship it has the potential to affect other relationships too

The Bible speaks about marriage, friendship, parenting, employer relations, how to treat others and have a great relationship with God

John 15:13–15 (NKJV)

¹³ Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends. ¹⁴ You are My friends if you do whatever I command you. ¹⁵ No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you.

Relationships are fostered by sacrifice, obedience to Christ and open, honest communication

1 John 1:7–9 (NKJV)

⁷ But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin.

⁸ If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Proverbs 18:1 (NKJV)

18 A man who isolates himself seeks his own desire; He rages against all wise judgment.

When we make a choice to seek our own desire in a relationship we end up isolating ourselves

This happens when we are looking at relationships for our own gain – instead of contributing to one

- We may need constant approval
- We may want to achieve a certain goal
- When we live this way we make decisions that support our particular pursuits – our agenda
- We tend to gravitate to others with our same weakness
 Alcohol, drugs, gossip, etc.
- We should seek out relationships that challenge us and ultimately strengthen us

We need people who will build us up and take us forward in life - A good friend does just that

Proverbs 18:24 (NKJV)

A man *who has* friends must himself be friendly, But there is a friend *who* sticks closer than a brother.

Some of our most pleasurable times in life are enjoying a meal with close friends

Friendships are one of the key elements of a blessed life

Thousands would crowd around Jesus to hear Him teach

His twelve companions gathered together with Him in that upper room the night He was betrayed They shared in His most intimate moments of life Many people never attract others into their lives because their attitude is more about what they can get rather than what they can give

They miss out in the blessing of true friendship

Just as we need to make deposits in a bank before we can make a withdrawal we must invest in our relationships

There are many people who wan to be everyone's friend but they never become anyone's true friend because they are unwilling to make a stand

Instead of giving a friend full support they sit on the fence and try to be everyone's friend – this wont work

 - The strength of a good friendship that goes the distance is that it has unconditional love
 - o They will believe in you no matter what
 - In the midst of busybodies or gossip
 - o They are committed to seeing you meet your potential
